USING PEER TUTORING TO IMPROVE STUDENT READING QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY BELFAST

The course introduced the peer tutoring method used to improve the reading attainment of children aged 8-14 years old in educational and non-educational settings. It looked at the evidence that supports the use of peer tutoring as a pedagogic technique and explored the benefits of using the method to promote learning. It led learners through the process of how to plan for and structure peer tutoring in reading, and gave advice on how to troubleshoot challenges in establishing the approach.

STUDY REQUIREMENT

3 weeks, 4 hours per week

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Explore the evidence that underpins the use of peer tutoring as a means to improve reading for students aged 8-14 years-old
- Examine (and apply) in which settings and contexts peer tutoring should be used as a means to improve reading for students aged 8-14 years-old
- Develop the skills of how to use peer tutoring as a means to improve reading for students aged 8-14 years-old in educational/childcare settings
- Reflect and discuss how to develop social and communication skills in students aged 8-14 years-old
